

Dual Credits at Carroll High School

What is Dual Credit?

- ❖ Sometimes called concurrent credit
- ❖ Student earns both high school and college credit for the same course

Can I transfer my credits?

- ❖ Request an official transcript from the university (typically the Registrar's Office) in which the dual credits are coming from
- ❖ If you take dual credit from more than one institution, you will need to request an official transcript from each institution with a minimal processing cost
- ❖ You then take those transcripts to the university in which you want them to transfer

What happens if I get a poor grade?

- ❖ Grades are recorded on your permanent college transcript and will follow you wherever you go.
- ❖ You do NOT have the option to have a course or grade not recorded on your college transcript if you are not happy with the grade.
- ❖ You can retake a course, and depending on the university, it will either replace the first grade or the first grade will be excluded(not counted in the GPA) but will still show on the transcript.
- ❖ A poor grade will indicate to universities that you were not up to the rigors of college and you might be redirected to start your college career elsewhere.
- ❖ Final point – take dual credit courses seriously.

Does dropping a dual credit course have any impact?

- ❖ When you drop a class after the first week of class and before the last day to withdraw, it shows up on your college transcript as W for withdraw.
- ❖ This saves your college grade point average but has an impact on federal financial aid
- ❖ The colleges will be able to explain what impact this has on that aid

What if I want to drop a dual credit class?

- Before seeing your counselor about dropping a dual credit course and leveling into the “regular” section of that course, you must complete the following steps first:
 - ✓ Talk to your teacher about your concerns
 - ✓ Talk to your parents about your concerns
 - ✓ Have your parents talk with the teacher about the concerns

Next Steps....

- If these steps have been taken, and everyone is in agreement, see your counselor to discuss the change
- Remember, if you do get approval to drop the course, you have the following options:
 - Your current grade in the dual credit class would go with you to the new class

OR

- You would need to make up the work that has been completed in the new class prior to your entering and do a “grade re-start”

Remember....

- You will still be responsible for the information that was covered prior to you entering the new class and will be responsible for that material on the final exam
- **AND** – if it is after P1 (or P5 if a 2nd semester class), you **cannot drop** the dual credit class. You will need to remain in the class until the end of the semester (If it is a yearlong class, you will be able to drop the dual credit class at the end of semester 1 but remember that you may not get any kind of refund from the college)

Important information to know if dropping a dual credit class

- The purpose of having a deadline to drop a dual credit class is to help with a smoother transition from a dual credit class to the “non-dual credit” equivalent and to avoid having a “withdrawal” recorded on your college transcript and possibly not receiving a refund from the college
- This is due to the following information:
- For Classes through IU:
 - For 1st semester classes: If a class is dropped AFTER Sept 25th, (This is after P1) there is NO REFUND for the class from IU and a GRADE OF W for Withdrawal is entered on the college transcript for that class

Con't....

- For 2nd semester IU classes: If a class is dropped **AFTER** Feb 5th, there is **NO REFUND** for the class from IU and a **GRADE OF W** for Withdrawal is entered on the college transcript for that class
- For Classes through PFW:
 - For 1st semester classes: If a class is dropped **AFTER** Aug 21st, you will no longer receive a 100% refund and the class will appear on the college transcript as a Withdrawal

Con't....

- For 2nd semester PFW classes: If a class is dropped AFTER Jan 15th, you will no longer receive a 100% refund and the class will appear on the college transcript as a Withdrawal
- For Yearlong PFW classes: If a class is dropped after Aug 30th, you will no longer receive a 100% refund and the class will appear on the college transcript as a Withdrawal

Final thoughts about dropping a dual credit class

- If the “non-dual credit” equivalent of the class is full, students will not be able to drop the dual credit class
- If dropping Literary Interpretations, you will be put into Novels as long as there is room in that class
- If dropping Composition, you will be put into either Creative Writing or Technical Communications as long as there is room in those classes

Ivy Tech, Cont.

- ❑ All classes through Ivy Tech are free – no cost for the dual credits
- ❑ NOTE:
- ❑ In order to get the dual credits for Principles of Engineering and Civil Engineering, students MUST have already received dual credit in Intro to Engineering Design
- ❑ In order to get the dual credits for Radio/TV II, students MUST have already received dual credit in Radio/TV I
- ❑ In order to get the dual credits for HOSP 105 in Culinary Arts & Hospit.II, students MUST have received dual credit for HOSP 101 in Culinary Arts & Hospitality I

To Request a Transcript from Ivy Tech to be Sent to Another College

If you have taken dual credit courses with Ivy Tech and would like to order your transcript for use at another college or university, follow these steps:

- Visit StudentClearingHouse.org
- In the task bar, locate the “Order-Track-Verify” dropdown menu and select “Order or Track a Transcript”
- In the “Select School” dropdown menu, select Ivy Tech Community College and Click “Submit”
- Read the important information listed about ordering a transcript and then click “Start” at the bottom of the page
- Complete the information step by step until you come to the sign consent section, at which point you will submit your request
- Your request can take 5-7 business days to be processed and sent to the designated email or physical address you have chosen

Admission Requirements to Receive Dual Credits

- PFW

- ❖ 2.8 overall GPA
 - ❖ Pre-req's for certain classes with a "C" or better
 - ❖ Completed Parent Permission form
 - ❖ Completed Application
- Ann Brown from PFW comes to Carroll HS in the spring to give information about dual credit opportunities. Students who have chosen a PFW Dual Credit course for the following school year MUST attend this meeting. Students will receive two required Parent Permission forms at this meeting.

PFW, Cont.

- Ann Brown will then come back within two weeks after the initial meeting to help students apply online to PFW for the dual credits
- Students will need to have completed and turned in both Parent Permission forms to their counselor by the due date and will need to have their social security number in order to apply

Admission Requirements to Receive Dual Credits:

- Ivy Tech
 - ❖ Certain “Knowledge Assessment” scores, PSAT, SAT, or ACT scores are needed to qualify for the dual credits for some of the classes. Juniors and seniors can also be eligible for dual credits if they have an overall GPA of a 2.6
 - Completed online application is also required which is done during class time during those classes which are eligible for dual credit

Admission Requirements to Receive Dual Credits:

- IU
 - ❖ 2.7 overall GPA
 - ❖ “C” average in pre-requisite courses
 - ❖ Students will be given information about how to register for courses from the classroom teacher or through an email from IU– most of the registration for IU courses is done online sometime in September once the dual credit class has begun

Things to Think About....

- Always, always make sure that the dual credits you are receiving will transfer to the college/university you are thinking about attending
- You don't want to pay for a dual credit class only to find out that the credits do not transfer!
- Costs of dual credit courses are always subject to change!
