- Carpenters build or renovate everything from homes, schools, churches and hospitals to malls, airports, skyscrapers and highways
- Carpenters work with wood, fiberglass, metal, vinyl, plastic and other materials to create the interior and exterior of structures
- Millwrights install, maintain, diagnose, and repair industrial machines that usually cost millions of dollars
 - Every industry requires millwrights, such as energy, pharmaceutical, refinery, automotive, nuclear, manufacturing, transportation, postal service, and food processing
- Floor coverers are responsible for installing all types of flooring materials including carpet, laminates and vinyl, wood, and sports surfaces
- Graduates of the program receive an Associate's Degree in Applied Sciences from Ivy Tech
- A journeyman has a variety of advancement options to pursue such as foreman, superintendent, project manager, safety lead, apprenticeship instructor, senior management/operations, and even CEO or owner
- Only costs incurred are the purchase of required hand tools, classroom books & union dues; books are an estimated \$100 per year; not required to pay tuition to attend school
