Internship This presentation is for all freshmen and sophomores that are interested in the internship program and those juniors that have already been accepted into the internship program. Parents and students will learn about the various components and goals of the internship program. Parents and students will also learn what steps need to be taken to participate in the internship program and what requirements are expected once they have been accepted into the program.

Anthis Career Center This presentation is open to all parents and students who are interested in attending Anthis Career Center in the mornings or afternoons to participate in a variety of trade and career classes. Participation in the Anthis program is limited to juniors and seniors and these students are eligible to earn three (3) credits a semester in programs such as Automotive, Aviation, Cosmetology, Public Safety, and Welding. Representatives from Anthis will be with us to discuss their programs and answer questions you might have.

Advanced Placement Program (AP) This presentation is open to all parents and students. The Advanced Placement Program (AP) gives students an opportunity to take college-level courses and exams while in high school. Students are required to take the AP exam for each AP course in which they are enrolled. Each semester grade earned in an AP course receives two additional grade points in the calculation of the grade point average (GPA). The “weighting” of the GPA serves as a motivator and a reward for the increased rigor of AP courses. There are many benefits — studying interesting and challenging topics, discovering new interests and getting a head start on their college future.

Health Careers This presentation is open to all parents and students and will provide information regarding courses and program design. Come learn about all of the courses that relate to Allied Health Careers. Courses include: Introduction to Health Careers, Medical Terminology (Dual Credit), Introduction to Athletic Training, Prevention & Care of Athletic Injuries and Senior Internship/ Health Careers.

Dual Credit This presentation is open to all parents and students. CHS partners with several Indiana colleges and universities to provide students with the opportunity to simultaneously earn both high school and college credits at a reduced cost point. CHS partners with local colleges and universities such as Ball State, PFW, Ivy Tech and Indiana University to offer a variety of courses for dual credit. Come learn about the course offerings and benefits of the dual credit program.

Departmental Presentations This presentation is open to all parents and students. English, Math and Science department chairs will present on the different course offerings and curriculum design within their discipline.
